Electrical 1A

(90 hrs)

EL5611A

Introduces apprentices to the electrical trade by developing safe work habits, proper tool use, and fundamental electrical theory. Students learn electrical terminology, basic math, OSHA safety requirements, hand and power tool operation, electrical test equipment, conductor identification, and introductory National Electrical Code (NEC) requirements. Laboratory activities focus on wiring methods, device terminations, cable installation, raceway systems, and developing quality workmanship while emphasizing safe installation practices.

☐ **Electrical 2A** (90 hrs) **EL5612A**

Build upon foundational knowledge by expanding students understanding of electrical theory, residential and light commercial wiring systems, and National Electrical Code requirements. Apprentices study branch circuits, grounding and bonding, overcurrent protection, electrical services, conduit installation, box fill calculations, conductor sizing, and blueprint interpretation. Laboratory exercises reinforce practical installation skills through residential and commercial wiring projects while emphasizing code compliance and proper installation techniques.

Classes start: Wednesday, September 9th, 2026 Mon/Wed 5:30-8:30pm

☐ **Electrical 3A** (90 hrs) **EL5613A**

Advances apprentices into commercial electrical applications with emphasis on transformers, motors, motor controls, commercial distribution systems, lighting systems, and advanced conduit installation. Students develop proficiency in reading electrical drawings, interpreting wiring diagrams, performing load calculations, and applying NEC requirements to commercial installations. Hands-on laboratories provide experience with motor control circuits, transformer connections, commercial wiring methods, and troubleshooting techniques.

Classes start: Tuesday, September 8th, 2026 Tue/Thurs 5-8pm

☐ **Electrical 4A** (90 hrs) **EL5614A**

Prepares apprentices for advanced field responsibilities through in-depth study of electrical distribution systems, commercial and industrial installations, advanced motor controls, generators, power quality, and specialized electrical systems. Students strengthen their abilities in electrical calculations, estimating, system planning, troubleshooting, and code application while developing leadership and project coordination skills. Laboratory activities emphasize complex installations, diagnostic procedures, and real-world commercial and industrial applications.

Classes start: Wednesday, September 9th, 2026 Mon/Wed 5-8pm

☐ **Electrical 5A** (90 hrs) **EL5615A**

Serves as the capstone of the apprenticeship program by integrating the knowledge and skills acquired throughout previous levels. Students refine their understanding of advanced electrical systems, electrical estimating, project planning, system troubleshooting, emerging technologies, and current National Electrical Code requirements. Emphasis is placed on leadership, professionalism, communication, quality workmanship, and preparing apprentices for successful careers as journey-level electricians through comprehensive hands-on projects and practical applications of industry standards.
